## Board of Education Meeting Update July 20, 2010

The Community R-VI Board of Education met in Regular Session on Tuesday, July 20, 2010. Andrew Fairchild, Board President, called the meeting to order at 7:16 p.m.

The Board voted to approve the agenda. The Board approved the June 15 and June 25, 2010 meeting minutes. The Board approved the transfer from the general fund to the teacher's fund to cover monthly expenditures.

The Board voted to set 2010-2011 athletic admissions the same as last year. Athletic admissions are as follows: Adult - \$3.00; Student - \$2.00; Maximum of \$7.00 per family. Season passes, for 10 admissions, will be \$25.00 for adult and \$10.00 for students. Family will be a maximum of 2 punches on an adult pass and may include father, mother, and dependent children living the same household. Lifetime Senior Citizens passes will be issued at no charge to patrons of the R-VI School District 65 years of age or older.

The Board approved dual credit agreements with Moberly Area Community College (MACC) and Central Methodist University (CMU). These agreements allow students to take classes taught by MACC or CMU professors via interactive television (ITV) and receive college credit for those courses.

The Board voted to set 2010-2011 lunch prices the same as last year. Prices are as follows: Elementary - \$1.25; Secondary - \$1.50; and Adult - \$2.00. Breakfast prices will also remain the same as last school year, which was: Elementary - \$1.00; Secondary - \$1.00; Adult - \$1.25. Milk prices will remain at \$0.25 per carton.

The Board adopted the guidelines of the Free and Reduced Lunch program. The program sets the price for K-12 reduced lunch at \$0.40 and breakfast at \$0.30.

The Board voted to employ Cynthia Fort, registered nurse, to supervise LeeAnn Meador, licensed practical nurse. The Board voted to approve payment of the July 2010 bills.

There were no presentations. Andy Fairchild read thank you notes from Lin Servizzi with United Healthcare and Rita Wright with Martinsburg Bank and Trust. Becky Schafer commended on the new Future Farmers of America (FFA) advisor attending the Audrain County 4-H Fair.

There were no citizen's comments. There was no old business.

Bakery bids were received from Goodwin's Grocery and Hostess (Interstate) Brands. The Board voted to accept the bid from Hostess Brands.

Dairy bids were received from Central Dairy Company and Kohl Wholesale. The Board voted to accept the bid from Central Dairy Company.

Fuel and lubricant bids were received from Audrain Oil Company and Martinsburg Farmer's Elevator. The Board voted to accept the bid from Audrain Oil Company.

Bids to asphalt the circle drive were received from APAC Missouri, Inc. and Christensen Construction Company. The Board voted to accept the bid from Christensen Construction Company.

Arlen Provancha, Superintendent, gave the transportation report and summer school attendance data. Mr. Provancha stated the 2009-2010 audit went well.

Natalie Gibson, Elementary Principal, reported on the elementary summer school attendance and activities. She gave a report on the Poker Run, which was held on July 10 as a fundraiser for elementary Cardinals tickets. Mrs. Gibson reported on the Professional Learning Communities (PLC) team and Buddy Backpack food program, which is in cooperation with Central Missouri Community Action (CMCA).

Dale Marshall, Secondary Principal, gave an update on FFA. At 7:57 p.m., the Board voted to adjourn the meeting.
